

Bledlow Preschool Curriculum

When children leave Bledlow Preschool we believe they should have some or all of the following skills:

Personal, social and emotional development:

- To form friendships and to actively engage in conversation with adults and other children.
- To start to talk about how they are feeling.

Communication and Language:

- To understand and to follow instructions.
- To use gestures and be able to articulate to adults and their peers.

Understanding the World:

- To have a good understanding of the environment they live in.
- To understand how to care for living things.
- To learn that we are all different and know that's ok.
- To experience how mechanical toys/equipment work.

Literacy:

 To recognise own name and to recognise some letters accurately in their name

Physical:

 To develop their gross and fine motor skills e.g. to use scissors, catching a ball etc.

Self Help Skills:

- Put on their shoes and coat.
- To zip up their coats and pour their own drinks.

Secure in numbers 0 - 5/10:

- To recite, match numerals to objects and recognise numbers in order 0-5/10.
- To understand some mathematical concepts such as size, weight and measure.
- To have an understanding of basic shapes.
